

GRE - Graduate Record Examination

Students need to be prepared in order to score well on the GRE!

School of Business students should plan to take the GRE in their senior year. The score is usually valid for up to 5 years. Therefore, if you plan to go to graduate school in the next couple of years, plan to take the GRE while your test taking skills are sharp. Study for at least several months before taking the GRE! Only take the test if you are properly prepared to score well. You may take the test once a month (21 days apart), up to 5 times a year. Scores range from 130 -170 for the Verbal and Quantitative sections.

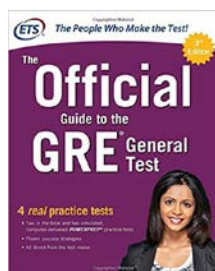

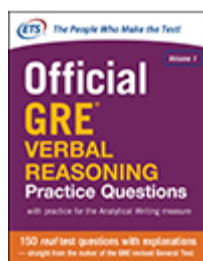

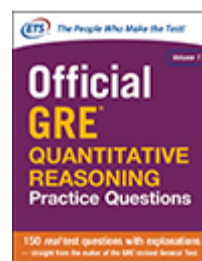

Analytical Writing

The Analytical Writing measure tests your critical thinking and analytical writing skills. It assesses your ability to articulate and support complex ideas, construct and evaluate arguments, and sustain a focused and coherent discussion. It does not assess specific content knowledge.

The Analytical Writing measure consists of two separately timed 30 minute analytical writing tasks:

The Issue task presents an opinion on an issue of general interest followed by specific instructions on how to respond to that issue. You are required to evaluate the issue, consider its complexities and develop an argument with reasons and examples to support your views.

The Argument task requires you to evaluate a given argument according to specific instructions. You will need to consider the logical soundness of the argument rather than agree or disagree with the position it presents.

The two tasks are complementary in that one requires you to construct your own argument by taking a position and providing evidence supporting your views on an issue, and the other requires you to evaluate someone else's argument by assessing its claims and evaluating the evidence it provides.

Verbal Reasoning

The Verbal Reasoning measure of the GRE revised General Test assesses your ability to analyze and evaluate written material and synthesize information obtained from it, analyze relationships among component parts of sentences and recognize relationships among words and concepts.

Verbal Reasoning questions appear in several formats. About half of the measure requires you to read passages and answer questions on those passages. The other half requires you to read, interpret and complete existing sentences, groups of sentences or paragraphs.

Verbal Reasoning questions types are: Reading Comprehension, Text Completion, and Sentence Equivalence.

Quantitative Reasoning

The Quantitative Reasoning measure of the GRE revised General Test assesses your basic math skills, understanding of elementary mathematical concepts, ability to reason quantitatively and model and solve problems with quantitative methods.

The content in these areas includes high school mathematics and statistics at a level that is generally no higher than a second course in algebra; it does not include trigonometry, calculus or other higher-level mathematics.

Quantitative Reasoning questions types are: Arithmetic, Algebra, Geometry and Data Analysis.
